

## A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon improvement scheme

## Archaeology Open Day Mill Common, Huntingdon Saturday 18 May 2019 (10am to 3pm)



Come and see the archaeological excavation taking place as part of Highways England's A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon improvement scheme. An open day is taking place on Saturday 18 May from 10am to 3pm at Mill Common, Huntingdon\* where archaeologists are excavating along the route of the Pathfinder Link Road into Huntingdon.

Free guided tours of the site will be available every 30 minutes from 10am to midday and 1pm until the last tour starts at 2.30pm. **Visitors should wear sturdy shoes or boots and warm clothing on site**.

This event follows a successful open day in the first part of the site (in December), and we can now reveal findings in the southern part of the site. This site is revealing more Medieval remains including; a cobbled road, ditches and pits. Finds so far include; Romano-British, Medieval and Post Medieval pottery, animal bones and evidence for later activity and we also have some evidence from the Civil War.

Visitors to the site on Mill Common (opposite Huntingdon Bus Station) will be able to see more of the finds from the excavations, meet some of the archaeologists and find out more about the excavations along the A14. The excavations are undertaken in conjunction with Cambridgeshire County Council, advising in their role as curators of the archaeological and historic environment.
